Funding for International Research Collaborations Involving Graduate Students

General Details10 awards of up to \$0,000 each are available to support international research collaborations involving graduate students. It is anticipated that these funds will be used primarily to support the travel of faculty and graduate students from Queen's to potential partner institutions, and vice/ersa, to develop meaningful international research partnerships. These collaborations will generally be initiated by faculty members.

Goals:The aim of these awards is to increase international research activity within the Faculty of students, and provide a means lefveraging funding opportunities such as the MITACS Globalinks program or other sources.

Funding Streams: Two streams of funding are available:

- 1. New partnerships This stream is intended to provide funding to reduce the barrier to initiating new international research activities by, for instance, supporting the travel of a faculty member(s) and graduate student(s) at Queen's to visit potential international research collaborators and to help support new international collaborators to visit Queen's.
- 2. Existing partnerships This stream is intended to help faculty members develop new collaborative projects that involve graduate students within the scope of existing international research partnerships.

Application Process: The application should be sent tartsci.international@queensu.ca. Applications will be evaluated once per term, with deadline **Eedf** ruary 1 June 1 and October 1. A complete application consists of

- x A list of all anticipated participants included whether these interactions are new or existing (i.e. which stream the application is being submitted to)
- x CVs of all participants
- x 1 page description of theresearch project
- x 1 page description of how the graduate student(s) will be involved
- x Budget

Reporting:No later than 30 daysfter the completion of the project, the applicant must report on:

- x The use of the funds
- x A clear plan for further collaboration indicating any planned joint funding applications, co-supervisions of students, etc.
- x The number of graduate students involve and the form of that involvement
- x Any outcomes such as papers, conferences, etc.

Eligible expenses:
