

VIEW SIMILARITY SCORES

To view Student Assignment Submissions under the Turnitin Similarity tab, click on the Turnitin Similarity icon in the top right corner of the page.

2. Select the Assignment Submission Folder containing the submissions you wish to view.
3. Click the black drop-down arrow to the right of the Assignment Submission Folder name and select **View Submissions**.
4. Scroll to the bottom of the page to view a list of submissions.
5. The Similarity score for each assignment will be shown in the Turnitin Similarity column.

6. To grade the assignment using Turnitin GradeMark click on the Pencil icon to access the Turnitin Originality report.

Note: If the report is not ready you will see **In Progress** in the Turnitin Similarity column for that assignment.

Legend for Similarity Score Color Coding:

Green: One word to 24% matching text

Yellow: 25-49% matching text

Orange: 50-74% matching text

Red: 75-100% matching text




The icons indicate the percentage of the similarity score and the corresponding color on a blue (0%) to red scale (100%).
