

Course Description

Explore the fascinating world of psychology theories of behavior and the mind. Using a combination of online lecture and activities, you will explore research in key areas of psychology including perception, cognition, learning, motivation, child development, individual differences, social psychology and abnormal (clinical) psychology. In the process you will hopefully gain some insight into what makes us think, feel and behave the way that we do.

The course material will be available in the form of weekly online lecture and quizzes with a forum for uni-level discussion and discussion material in material discussion board in the online discussion forum. We have included homework to help you keep up with the reading, and a formative assessment and be assessed through work with your lab partner. The discussion and quizzes require your active participation throughout the course.
