A Summary Statement of the Studies and/or Research:

My study emerged within a wide spread call to ac on for universi es to address the racial harm and violence experienced by students both on and o campus (Bowden, 2020). In Canada, a growing number of universi es have established an racist policies including policies related to teaching and learning (Abawi, 2018). Studies show that graduate students recognize the importance of an racism in their teaching prac ces (Hill, 2014) and that Canadian ins tu ons have begun implemen ng graduate student teaching professional development that explicitly addresses cultural safety (Breau et al., 2020). However, research is needed to be er understand the par cular needs of graduate students that are Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour (BIPoC)—especially considering how many BIPoC graduate students engage in an racist work on campus (Linder et al., 2019).

Research process

The purpose of this study is to develop deeper understandings of the supports BIPoC graduate students need in their development as an racist educators. For this study, I will analyze my own experiences as a graduate student and an racist educator of colour. My first person perspec ve will be used to develop deep insights into the kind of complexies BIPoC graduate students face in their development as an racist educators. Based on these insights, a framework will be developed that can be used by university educators, administrators, and stall when crealing and implementing an racist education policies and supports for BIPoC graduate students. This study will be conducted using self study and hermeneutic methodologies. Self study involves researchers developing insight about education by investigating and their own teaching practices. Hermeneutics outlines how interpretations of our experiences are shaped by our individual social, historical, and cultural dircumstances. Together, self study and hermeneutics highlight how subjective experiences are crucial for changing how we understand and value knowledge and therefore also how we pursue social change in transformative ways (Meyer, 2013). Data will be collected from two sources. 1) anecdotes of my experiences and 2) conversations with other BIPoC an racist educators.

Anecdotes of Experiences. I will reflect on hermeneu c ques ons to select which experiences to analyze for this study. Hermeneu c ques ons are ones that inquire into a phenomenon while also resis ng linear, straight forward responses. Poten al hermeneu c ques ons include: 1. How do I know and come to know about racism? 2. Where and how do I teach about racism? 3. How does teaching and learning happen in university ins tu ons? 4. What does it mean to be an an racist educator? These experiences will be analyzed as anecdotes which will include memories and ar facts connected to these memories. Examples of ar facts include teaching evalua ons, e mails, journals, and art.

Conversa ons with Other BIPoC An racist Educators. I will invite BIPoC educators to have conversa ons with me about the aforemen oned anecdotes and hermeneu c ques ons as a way of externally and orally interpre ng my experiences. These BIPoC an racist educators will be ones who have played important roles in my journey and growth as an an racist educator (i.e. ones that have men d, taugh, and/or work alongside me in an racism capaci es)esth conversa ons will be one on one and I plan on having a total of 5 10 conversa ons. Data collected from these conversa ons will be my reflec ons on what I learned about my own experiences through discussing them. These reflec ons may be writen or recorded in other multimodal ways (e.g. pain ngs and other art forms, video, audio

Mul modal storytelling. Analyzing experience involves transla ng our pre ar culate thoughts into a form that is representa ve of our ideas, thoughts, and feelings. Through this transla on, we engage in a process of narra vizing our experiences. As such, data will be analyzed for emergent themes using an itera ve process of mul modal storytelling. Findings will be re
