

1.0 Introduction

This Standard Operating Procedure outlines the necessary responsibility of the Departments with regards to Fire Safety Equipment and Procedures. In accordance with Provincial Legislation, the Department of Environmental Health & Safety has listed the following items that are to be followed when decorating.

The following are based on the requirements of the Ontario Building and Fire Codes. Assistance in using these guidelines and meeting the requirements of the provincial codes is available from the Department of Environmental Health & Safety

2.0 Scope

This SOP applies to decorations in all Quedohiversity buildings.

3.0 Applicable Legislation:

The Ontario Building Code Adt992 (O. Reg. 332/12)

The Ontario Fire Code (O. Reg. 213/07) as amended by (O. Reg. 194/14)

4.0 Responsibilities

4.1 Directors, Department Heads and Managers

Each shallensure that the trinent supervisors, employees, students and contractors are aware of this SOP and that all decorations meet the conditional steel below.

4.2 Department of Environmentalealth and Safety

Shall ensure that ach department is made aware of responsibilities under this procedure.


Serve as a resource to individualsich require assistnce in complying with this SOP.

Conduct regular inspections to ensure that faculties, departments and units are complying with the requirements of the SOP and the Ontario Building and Fire Codes.

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6.0 Candles and Open Flame Devices:

Candles and open flame devious luding those with glass shades or globes are not permitted; except as approved by the Department of Environment and Safety.

7.0 Holiday Fire Safety Information:

Trees:

Real trees are not permitted.

Only artificial trees that have be treated with a flame retardant are permitted

Artificial trees are not permitted in hallways and corridors

Artificial trees shall be kept away from doorways and heat sources.

Do not remove the tag that indicates the fire resistance rating

Decorative Lights:

Use only lights that bear the Underwriters Laboratory (QAINC) seal of approval.

Do not use lights with loose sockets or frayed or damaged wires.

Do not run wiring through doorways, under carpeting, or through holes in walls.

Never plugone extension cord into another.

Multiple-outlet power strip with an internal circuit breaker arrecommended.

Always turn the decorative lights off when the area is unoccupied.

Never wrap decorative lights around exposed sprinkler pipes.
