Further to my brief comments at the last Senate meeting, I have now for intransity owall academic and non-academic units to out birthe 20122013 budget planning paramete Tsuese include:

- x All units' 20122013 operating budgets will be unchanged from their-2012 levels; this means that the previously announced achests and budget cut of 1.5 percent will not now be applied.
- x All units will be responsible for increases in salary and benefit costs, including the special pension charge of three percent of pensionable earnings, up from one percent of pensionable earnings in 201-2012.
- x The distribution of a portion of government grant and tuition revenue increases to Faculties is suspended, pending the outcome of the development of a new budget model, which will be implemented for the 201-2014 budget year.
- x In anticipation of this new budget model, units will this year be asked to prepare a budget for only 20122013, and not for successive years.

Unit heads have been asked to provide both plans and associated budgets by late.November Meetings to discuss submissions will begin in
